 - (1) Certify buildings as sustainable.
 - (2) Certify hospital design engineers, etc.
 - i. TAC Divided up 9 or 10 of the long term goals into three categories and put task forces together to study some things. Category One: Develop design guidance to integrate IAQ, energy efficiency and other aspects of sustainable building performance. To develop performance metrics and rating systems to certify operational performance of buildings for energy efficiency and IEQ. Collaborate with other organizations to integrate HVAC & R

systems with other building systems to enhance effectiveness of total building design and integral practice.

Category Two: Provide training, guidance and tools for building operators. Conduct research and development and develop guidance to enhance the effectiveness of maintenance procedures. Promote use of life cycle cost analysis to building owners to encourage sustainable building construction operation and renewal. Category Three: Lead the drive towards design, construction, operation and net zero energy buildings through research publications and education. Promote research leading to the development of equipment and systems that support sustainable

USGBC Version NC 2.2 is out. LEEB-EB is active. Core and Shell is in pilot stage. USGBC and ASHRAE are doing a project (Special Publication) to put LEED into code format so that people can adopt LEED as a high performance building code.

EPA & DOE wrote Energy Policy Act. They want to mandate USGBC LEED and follow through to see that it is done.

Andy Nolfo – Certify high performance building. Also certify individuals. He is opposed to ASHRAE certifying commissioning agents. He says to certify HVAC designers first.

Carl Lawson – Against certifying commissioning agents or projects. Gerry Kettler – Should ASHRAE create the skill set? Janice Peterson – She agrees.

A certification program requires a document against which agents will be examined against.

Charlie Culp – He discussed the financial aspects of such a program.

- 17. Andy Nolfo made a **motion** that the committee state that we are opposed to the strategic plan including the word "certification" in any shape or form since the purpose of ASHRAE is to educate. Seconded by Rodney Lewis.
 - TC 7.9 strongly urged ASHRAE to delete the word "certification" from its current Strategic Plan. Nine for, two opposed.
 - Gerry Kettler to write the letter.
