Lucas B. Hyman has provided technical leadership to TC 1.10 (Cogeneration Systems) for more than four years. He has also made very significant technical contributions to TC 6.2 (District Energy) and TC 6.9 (Thermal Storage). Mr. Hyman is the author and Instructor of two 3-hour courses on Combined Heating & Power (CHP), both of which were approved by ASHRAE's Professional Development Committee (PDC). He is now developing an on-line course on the same subject. In the last four years Mr. Hyman has authored and co- authored two books, respectively: Thermal Storage Systems and Sustainable On-Site CHP Systems. The peer review is conducted to help ensure that the information in the guide is useful and applicable to the targeted audience.
